GUIDELINES FOR LENT

ABSTINENCE-All faithful who have reached 14 years of age are required to abstain totally from meat on Ash Wednesday and Fridays in Lent.

FASTING-All faithful between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive are bound to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. This practice involves limiting oneself to a single full meal and avoiding food between. Light sustenance may be taken on two other occasions during the day.


