# Mature Adult Parishioners Visit Mother Cabrini Shrine

Recently a group of twenty of your fellow parishioners from the Mature Adult Parishioner group (MAPs) travelled to the Shrine of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini in Washington Heights in upper Manhattan. The Shrine presents the life and work of Francesca Cabrini, born in a small Italian village called S'ant Angelo Lodigiano on July 15, 1850. Mother Cabrini was the first U.S. citizen to be canonized a saint by the Church, on July 7, 1946.

As a child she dreamed of being a missionary in China. By 1880 she founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart in pursuit of her calling. In 1889 at the behest of Pope Leo XIII, this courageous Italian woman, was persuaded to travel "not to the East, but to the West," to New York in order to minister to the spiritual and physical needs of the thousands of Italian Immigrants who were arriving every week and who were not being adequately served by the Church of the time. These new immigrants were not receiving a welcome as much as a reproach in their new home and many were living in despair and poverty and falling away from the Faith.

We learned that this exceptional woman was incredibly resourceful as she raised money, negotiated contracts, oversaw construction and renovation projects and worked out the countless problems and pitfalls that hampered her work of catechizing and caring for her fellow immigrant Catholics. She was so successful that by the time of her death in 1917 she had established 67 hospitals, schools and orphanages in the United States (New York, Chicago, New Orleans, Colorado, etc.) and South America.

As impressive as her accomplishments were she established a robust prayer life as the foundation of her work and was a prolific writer leaving her many spiritual insights to benefit us today. Her order continues to enrich our Church today.

We also attended Mass and Eucharistic Adoration at the Shrine and it was a beautiful experience. After our visit to the Shrine, our MAP group headed to Enzo's on Arthur Avenue in the Bronx for a shared meal.
